
4. Risks of a vaccine reaction

Some people may have a mild allergic reaction to a vaccine. This is usually a rash or hives. These reactions are usually mild and go away on their own. However, some people may have a severe allergic reaction. This is a medical emergency. If you or your child has a severe allergic reaction, call 9-1-1 immediately.

Some people may have a fever after getting a vaccine. This is usually a mild fever that goes away on its own. However, some people may have a high fever. If you or your child has a high fever, call your doctor.

5. What if there is a serious problem?

If you or your child has a serious allergic reaction to a vaccine, you should stop getting that vaccine. However, you should continue to get other vaccines. If you or your child has a serious allergic reaction, call your doctor. If you or your child has a severe allergic reaction, call 9-1-1 immediately.
